RULES FOR ALL STUDENTS

1. Yearly fixture or academic calendar is issued to every student at the beginning of the session. Parents must refer to it for information relating to functions, holidays, P.T.A. meetings and schedule for unit tests and examinations.
2. Students must carry their ID card and school diary to school every day.
3. The following are strictly prohibited:
 - a) Possession or use of mobile phone and other electronic gadgets within the school premises.
 - b) Day Scholars coming to school after normal school hours.
 - c) Leaving school early without permission of the Principal.
 - d) Day Scholars bringing food, clothing or other material for boarders.
 - e) Collecting cash/funds from other students for any reason.
 - f) Driving a two-wheeler without a valid driving license & written consent of the parents.
 - g) Riding a two wheeler without a helmet.
 - h) Permitting another student to ride her two wheeler.
 - i) Driving a car on campus.
 - j) Celebrating a birthday or occasion on campus in a manner that is against the specified format for such celebrations.

The school will not be liable for any damage/charges on account of injuries, fatal or otherwise, which may be sustained by the student at any time during her stay in the school while taking part in sports/games and any other form of activity of the school, within or outside the school premises. All expenses that may be incurred in the treatment of such injuries will be borne by the parent/guardian of the child.
