Dance

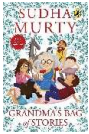

Do the work neatly.

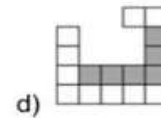
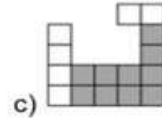
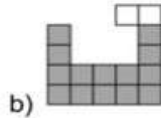
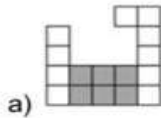
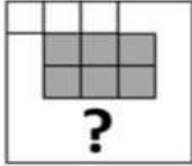

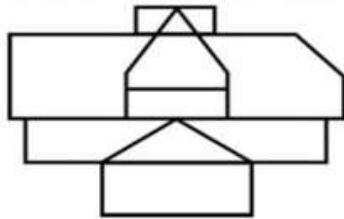

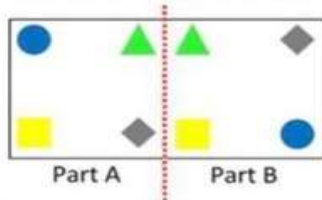

Art and Craft

Activity: Decorative Cardboard Shape

1. Cut a cardboard piece of any shape – circle, star, flower, etc.
2. Minimum size: 7 inches(diameter) on the longest side.
3. Decorate using sustainable materials only: jute, old buttons, newspaper rolls, dried leaves, fabric scraps, seeds, pistachio shells, etc.
4. Do not use plastic stickers or thermocol.

Cardboard can also be decorated with jute rope, and mirror pieces, nut shells, shells , feathers , etc.
