
FRESH POTATOES OR ROTTEN TOMATOES?



" For better or worse, the crown has landed on my head and I say we go" William Shakespeare wrote, "Uneasy lies the head that wears the crown" Often misquoted as "Heavy is the head that wears the crown". A combination of these interpretations should serve to briefly sum up Netflix's new, weighty period drama, "The Crown." Based on an award-winning play "The Audience", this lavish, drama chronicles the life of Queen Elizabeth II from the 1940s to modern times. Tracking her throughout her reign begins with a radical study of how her coronation drastically affected her life, the lives of those on the brink of her, and therefore the country she represents. Her eyes provide extensive insight into her turmoil; a key attribute for an actress portraying nobility in its most proper, refined moments. As the decades pass, personal intrigues, romances, and political rivalries are revealed that played an enormous role in events that shaped the later years of the 20th century. And albeit The Crown can never quite structure its mind about whether this quality of power and therefore the monarchy may be a good or bad thing, its eagerness to wrestle there upon question makes the series fascinating.


In this utterly powerful attempt on making the last living day of two teenage boys memorable, Adam Silvera very articulately portrays how two teenage boys with contrasting approaches towards life spend their 'End Days', aiming to live their lives in a day. Mateo, an introvert who achieves tranquillity only when locked inside the four walls of his room, plans on spending his end day the way he's lived his whole life; Alone in his room. On the other hand, Rufus, an adventurous adolescent gets a call that he will be dying today while he's jumping someone (not an ideal situation for him to be in). The two meet on an app and decide to meet up and spend their end days together. While eluding every possible way to die, they learn intimate details about each other and end up getting as thick as thieves. The term 'opposites attract' fits best to this young adult fiction. I would rate it an 8.5/10; the ending surely was the focal point. All in all, They Both Die at The End is a major page-turner, and all young adults fond of adventure, drama, and fiction must give it a read.


